Companion With The Poor, Inc. Youth Camp 2017 Updates

An average of 57% of the campers who attended this year's youth camp were followed up and channeled to the churches in the community. Youth camp is one of our strategies in reaching out the youth from our church planting communities. Camps serve as avenue for breakthrough among the youth; from their hopeless situation they find meaning when they get to know and encounter Christ during the camp. Companion With The Poor (CWTP) has been organizing youth camps since 2006, many of the campers are now leaders in their respective churches. Some are even motivated to continue and finish their studies, two of them is Ark Ariaga from Antipolo and Renalyn Dalicomocon from Montalban church planting areas who both graduated their bachelor's degree in education.

Updates:

1. Chosen Stone Ministries, Southville 8B, Montalban, Rizal

Ten (10) of fourteen (14) campers from Chosen Stone Church in Southville 8B are now actively ministering in the church. Some of them are in music ministry, some are teaching in children's ministry, and others are active in cell group ministry. Chosen Stone Ministries is a church planted by CWTP missionaries namely, Moises Maaghop, Ligaya Esquierda, Rebecca Bata-anon and Lindsey Mcdonald together with the local church partner, Pastor Joseph Monun.

2. Paopawan Church of Nazarene, Baras, Rizal

Paopawan church is another church planted by one of the CWTP teams led by Pastor Bart Valeriano with team members Paulette Amoroso, Delia Guera and local church partner, Pastor Nerio Bolic. Out of fourteen (14) campers who attended the camp, seven (7) are regularly attending their Sunday Worship Service and discipleship class in the church.

3. Robes 1, Camarin, Caloocan City

The church planting team of Pastor Mike Sabalza with two other church planters, Renato Milca Jr. and Marvin Cerina sent ten (10) youth from their community to join the camp. Four
