On Friday morning we have either a time with the mothers and babies or with the elderly women. The mamas love to join in too! The elderly ladies enjoy craft as well. We have done knitting and decorated photo frames, but I think bingo is the firm favourite even if some get disappointed when they don't win anything. It has even been known for the odd man to sneak in!



In the afternoon it is the children's program with songs, bible story and craft. Bavo also runs a football program for the boys.



As well as all this we have given out winter coats, hats and scarves, children's clothes, and kitchen equipment. A charity from America also gave each child a pair of wellington boots.

It has also been a time of lots of visitors. I had a great time with four friends from the UK who came to stay with me. We kept them very busy preparing programs. Tijs and Jess also had two sets of visitors. They were all a real

encouragement to us.
